



Dear Kidz Kamp Families;

We are excited about the opportunity to host another summer of Kidz Kamp. This year, as you can imagine, we are required to structure the program differently. We know there will be a lot of questions and we hope to address a few key changes in this letter. The health and safety of all associates and program participants is our highest priority. We are taking our role in mitigating the spread of COVID-19 seriously and our strategies may change if the level of community transmission increases to the point where intervening is warranted. Our policies in regards to the pandemic are living documents and will be updated and communicated to you in writing as the CDC and MDH update their guidelines.

Registration: We will take a limited number of registrations on a first come, first serve basis. It will be available to full time participants first and if space is available, we will open it up to part time participants. We will be doing “curbside” registration this year. That means that from 5:00pm-7:00pm on June 9th, 11th and 16th you can turn in your paperwork at the Hallett Center parking lot. You will also be required to turn in a check at that time to hold you spot. We will run all payments on June 29th. If you want to pay with a different method, please notify us so we do not cash the check. You will need to make the alternative payment on June 29th, in person. We will be updating the website and Facebook as to program availability.

Reservation: Your spot will automatically be reserved for session three until you notify us otherwise. Payment will be accepted for session three between July 20th and July 27th, payment will be processed on July 27th.

Closure and Quarantine: Once the session has started, if the government orders dictate the closure of Kidz Kamp or your participant needs to quarantine due to risk of exposure; reimbursements, credits or refunds will not be awarded. If there is a confirmed case of COVID-19, the Hallett Center will respond in accordance to the closures and cleaning outlined in the Hallett Center of Crosby Preparedness Plan including and not limited to closing the facility or programs.

Drop Off and Pick Up: Drop off and pickup will happen outside of the building at a side door. Each participant is required to wash or sanitize their hands before coming in to camp. Temperature screenings will take place upon arrival and again at lunch. Guardians will be notified if a temperature of 100.4°F or higher is recorded and will be asked to pick up the child immediately.

Social Distancing: Participants will be broken up into groups of no more than nine participants and one staff. Groups will not mix and participants will be asked to maintain 6 feet of separation. Daily activities will support social distancing therefore participants will not be going on field trips, swimming, playing at the park, etc. until group restrictions and distancing requirements are lightened. Personal items are to be kept separated and are not to be shared. Groups will be assigned to an area and all toys will be cleaned before moving as a group to a new area.

Respiratory Etiquette: Masks are not required and are encouraged. Please help educate your participant on covering their mouth if they need to cough or sneeze as well as minimizing touching their eyes, nose and mouth.

Signs and Symptoms: Symptoms of COVID-19 may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms should stay at home: Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fever, Chills, Muscle pain, Sore throat, and/or New loss of taste or smell. This list is not all inclusive. Other less common symptoms have been reported, including gastrointestinal symptoms like nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea. Please notify the Camp Coordinator if your child or anyone in the home is experiencing symptoms or have been exposed to a person with COVID-19. Participants are asked to stay at home when they are sick, when household members are sick, or when required by a health care provider to isolate or quarantine themselves or a member of their household.

The Kidz Kamp program will be reviewed on June 8, 2020 by the Crosby City Council. While this year's Kidz Kamp will function differently than previous years, we are hopeful that with everyone's help, the kids can safely play and interact.
